BECOMING A FOSSIL

When an animal dies, its body is slowly eaten by other animals or broken down by microorganisms. Just occasionally, it becomes a fossil.

1 In some cases, algae, coral and shells can be preserved in limestone and other rocks. In 2006, a scientist found fossilized remains of a dinosaur leg bone.

2 The soft parts of the body are eaten and broken down, but the hard parts—bones, teeth and claws—remain. Over hundreds and thousands of years, they are more and more embedded in the rock. The fossils dissolved in the water make them easier to see.

3 The scientist eventually has to excavate. Sometimes the remains of the creature.

SQUISHY BITS

Occasionally, soft parts of an animal are preserved and fossilized, including skin, feathers and even intestines. In 2006, a scientist found fossilized remains of a dinosaur leg bone.

PUTTING THE PARTS BACK TOGETHER

SAUROPODS

Giant sauropods are the largest animals that have ever walked the Earth. Some of the most famous come from North America. There were two main types: diplodocoids and macronarians.

DIPLODOCIDS

SUPERSAUROUS

Diplodocids and related dinosaurs like *Supersaurus*, *Apatosaurus* and *Brontosaurus* had long, square-shaped necks, big like teeth and long tails. *Supersaurus* had the longest neck of any North American sauropod, at up to five times its body length. Like other diplodocids, it could not breathe growing high in the trees that other dinosaurs couldn't reach, or graze low-growing plants.

MACRONARIANS

BRACHIOSAURUS

Brachiosaurus was unusual as its front legs were longer than its back legs. It stood like a giraffe, holding its neck up, and making it one of the tallest dinosaurs. Most sauropods held their necks and tails nearly horizontal at most of the time.

CAMARASAUROUS

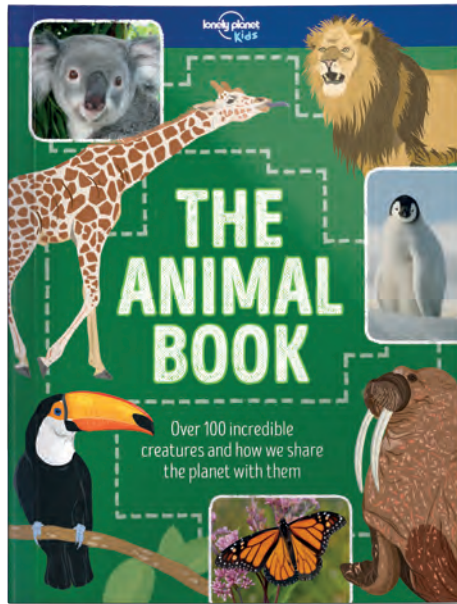
Camarasaurus had strong, club-shaped necks, up to 10cm long, for eating tough plants. Stockier than the diplodocids, it had a shorter, thicker neck and tail, and could not feed at ground level. Fossils of two adults and a young *Camarasaurus* have been found together, suggesting they lived in herds or family groups.

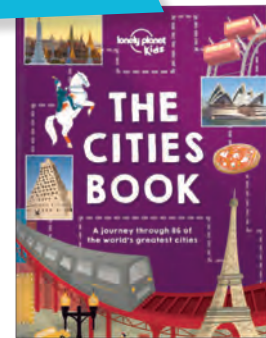

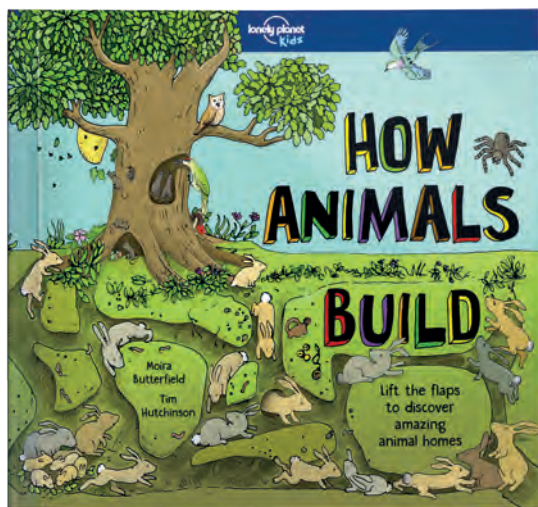

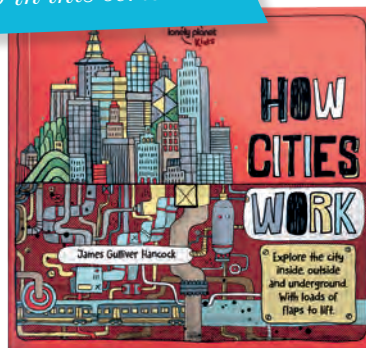

IT'S BUZZING IN HERE!

Bees squeeze wax out of their bodies to make a honeycomb - lots of six-sided cells joined together. The cells are tiny containers for bringing up baby bees or storing food.

BEE RANKS

Bees work as a team, each with their own job.



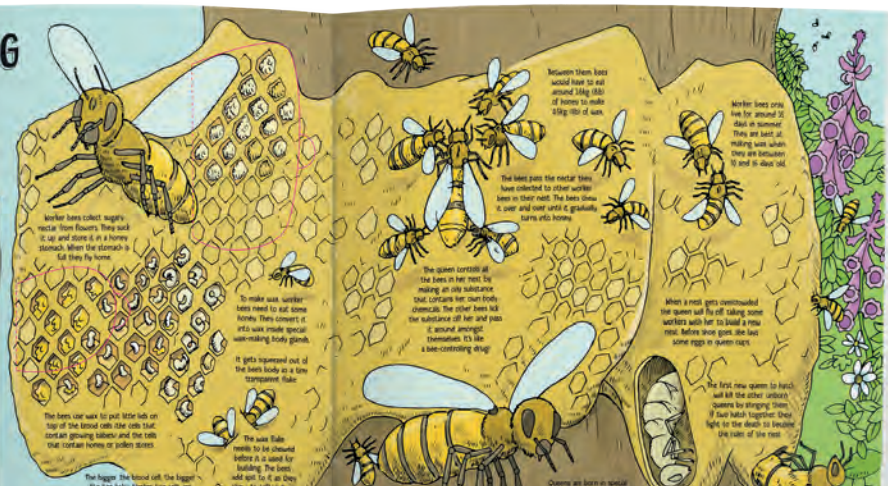
THE WORKER BEE gathers nectar and pollen for food and build the hive. They guard the nest and look after the bee larvae, too.



THE QUEEN is bigger than all the other bees. She is the only bee who lays eggs in a nest. She is fed and cleaned by her servants, the worker bees.



THE DRONE is a male bee that does not sting.



Worker bees collect nectar from flowers. They suck it up and store it in a honey stomach. When the stomach is full they fly home.

To make wax, worker bees need to eat some honey. They convert it into wax inside special wax-producing body glands.

It gets squeezed out of the bees' bodies as a fine transparent film.

The wax plate needs to be cleaned before it is used for building. The bees add spit to it, so they clean it before it is used.

Between them bees would take to eat around 15kg (33lb) of honey to make 1kg (2.2lb) of wax.

The bees pass the nectar from flower to flower. The bees then use it to make honey.

The queen controls all the bees in her nest by means of the substance that contains her own body chemicals. The other bees tell the substance of her and pass it around amongst themselves. It's like a bee-controlling drug!

Worker bees create new bees for around 30 days in summer. They are best at making wax when they are between 10 and 15 days old.

When a nest gets overcrowded the queen will fly off taking some workers with her to build a new nest. Before they go, she lays some eggs in queen cups.

The first new queen to hatch will kill the other queens, queens by stinging them. If she hatches together with her sisters, she will be the queen.

Queens are both in special cells.

THIS WAY TO WATERWORLD

There are home builders in the ocean, too. Just like land animals, the animals that live in the sea need to design dens to keep themselves safe or to impress a mate.

SHRIMP SECURITY

Some mantis shrimps build their homes by digging holes in sand and sealed rubble. The mantis will create a home and back entrance so it can escape if it needs to.

FANNED WITH LOVE
